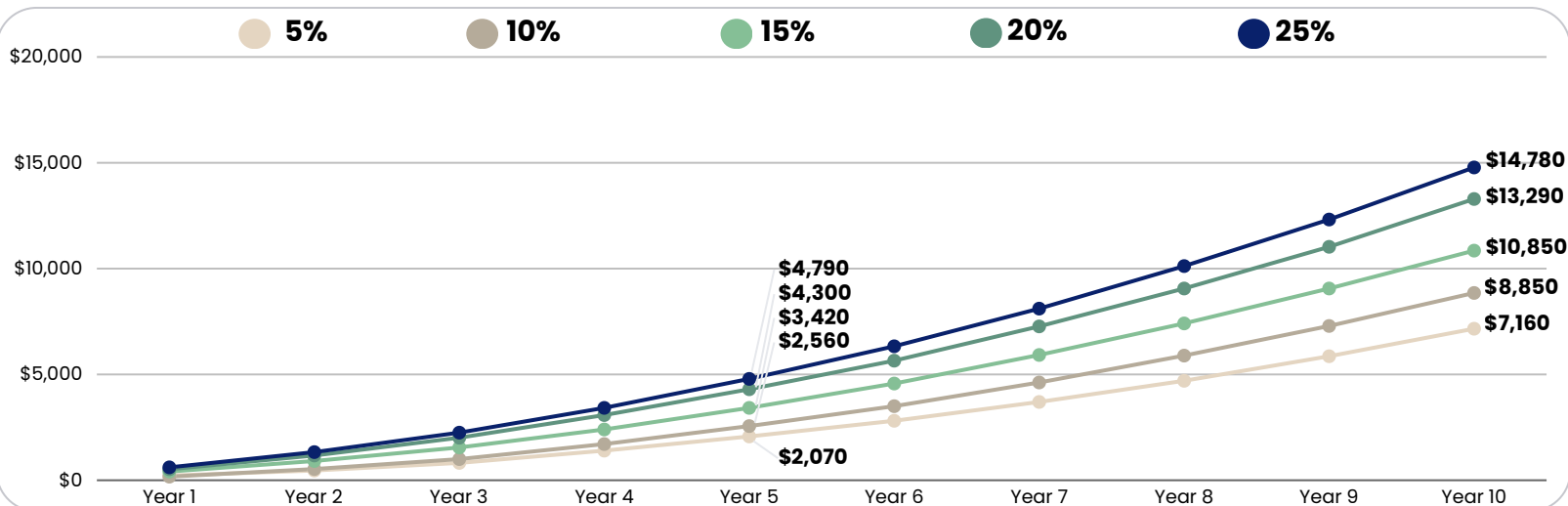
KEY SAVINGS OPPORTUNITY



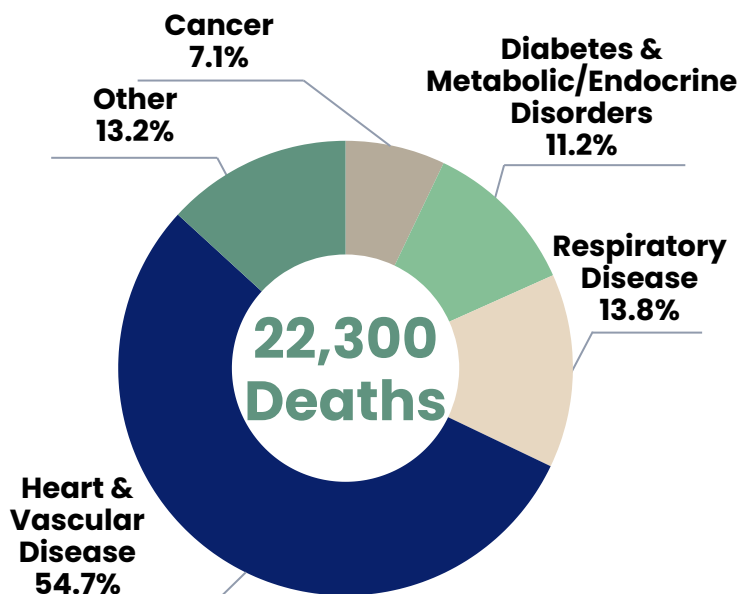
A **5%–25%** weight loss through sustained treatment among adults over 10 years could generate between **\$20.9B and \$43.2B** in cumulative medical cost savings

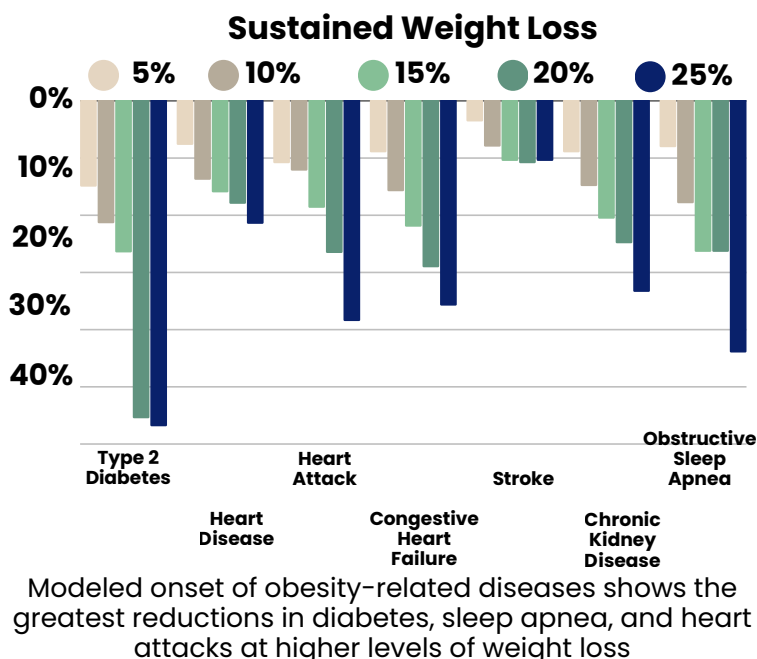
MEDICAL COST SAVINGS PER PERSON BY SUSTAINED WEIGHT LOSS
